### Education and Outreach

The district provides extensive education and outreach programs to schools and the community. Volunteers can help present programs on a wide variety of natural resources topics including soil and water quality, trees, wildlife, backyard conservation, creek exploration, rain gardens and composting. Volunteers who are knowledgeable about a specific natural resources topic are welcome to present programs in that area.

### Stream Monitoring

The district's Stream Team monitoring program trains volunteers on basic water quality monitoring methods. Volunteers then choose a stream to monitor and report results to the district. This activity is great for parents and children as they can explore a stream together and learn about water quality. Volunteers can share their results with neighbors and help increase awareness about water quality and conservation.



### Special Events & Projects

The district holds a variety of special events throughout the year including seedling tree sales, programs at the Hartford Fair, conservation tours, soil judging and Envirothon high school competitions, habitat restoration, and the district annual meeting. The district is always looking for volunteers to help with these events.
