



STORMWATER TECHNICIAN: Job Description

The Licking County Soil & Water Conservation District full time District Urban Technician will provide technical assistance and education for Licking County. This position will work with the County Stormwater Management Plan, Sediment, Erosion and Stormwater Regulations regarding MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) compliance with the Ohio EPA NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) Program. Our work environment is high energy, high activity and mutual support. We will provide opportunities for professional development and a team work experience.

Main responsibilities:

- MCM 3: Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination: Inspect and evaluate stormwater system, including outfall inspections and mapping.
- MCM4: Construction Site Runoff Control inspections in compliance with the Licking County Sediment, Erosion and Stormwater Regulations, EPA Construction General Permit and the approved Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans - Best Management Practices (BMPS).
- MCM 5: Post construction Stormwater Management: Annual inspections based on Operation and Maintenance plans on file.
- MCM6: Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping: assist with pollution prevention training and help with facility inspections.
- Earning and maintaining a minimum of Qualified Stormwater Compliance Inspector certification, Qualified Preparer of Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans (SWPPP) and ODA Technician Development Program Beginners level.
- Working with landowners/residents with technical assistance calls.
- Assists in conducting tours, field days and educational presentations to elected officials, contractors and general public at workshops.

Required Qualifications:

- Prefer a graduate of an accredited college with an Associates Degree or higher (preferably in civil engineering, natural resources management, environmental science or related field); or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
- Familiarity with Ohio EPA NPDES program, urban development BMPs and regulations related to erosion and sediment control.
- Willingness to perform a combination of technical, office and outdoor field work.
- Ability to traverse terrain in an outdoor environment, ability to carry and transport resource materials and equipment.
- Working knowledge of ArcView and or/ArcGIS is preferred, familiarity with Google and Microsoft Office suite a plus.
- Proof of valid Ohio driver's license and remain insurable.
- Ability to pass a Licking County pre-employment drug screening and BCI background security check.

Work hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with ½ hour unpaid lunch, Mon- Fri with a flexible work options. May be required to work evenings or weekends for events or professional development.
