<u>Largemouth Bass</u> 2-3" fingerling – sport fish that has an average size and weight between 12-20" and 2-6lbs in Ohio; spawn between mid-April – early June with water temps between 60-75 degrees; needs wood, rocks, docks or sand for spawning beds; main predator in ponds; feeds on smaller game fish, crayfish, minnows, birds, snakes, and insects

<u>Bluegill</u> 2-3" fingerling- a forage and sport fish; average size between 6-8"; spawn multiple times throughout the summer (May-Aug), the peak spawn is primarily June in Ohio; feeds on insects, crayfish, and minnows; prey of largemouth bass

<u>Channel Catfish</u> 4-5" fingerling- a sport and food fish; offspring are forage for bass; average size between 15-25' and 2-10lbs; easier to catch after a hard rain; catfish like to spawn in holes or depressions in the banks so to encourage spawning place buckets or milk crates in your pond between 2-4ft

Hybrid Bluegill 2-4" fingerling- a forage and sport fish; known for their rapid growth to 10"; is a cross between a male bluegill and female green sunfish; feeds on insects, crayfish, and minnows; prey of largemouth bass

<u>Red Ear Shellcracker</u> 2-4"- closely related to the bluegill; popular pan fish; can grow up to 11"; feeds on snails, crayfish, insects, and insects

Fathead Minnow 1-2" fingerling- a forage fish; can grow to 3"; readily consumed by predatory species

<u>Japanese Koi</u> 6-8"- Maximum length is 3 ft; do best in ponds with more than one Koi; get along well with other, non-aggressive fish; great for controlling duckweed and other aquatic weeds

White Amur (Grass Carp) 8-14"- good for aquatic weed control

<u>Yellow Perch</u> 2-3" fingerling- spawn between mid-April to early May, requires brush or weeds to lay eggs; feeds on insects, crayfish, and minnows; prey for largemouth bass; schooling fish

<u>Black Crappie</u> 2-4" fingerlings- spawn between mid-March to mid-May in water temps from 60-70 degrees. Use dock posts, wood/branches/brush, and vegetation as cover. Feed on insects, crayfish, and minnows. Schooling fish, average size between 8-11'.

- Line container with non-deodorized plastic liner
- Fill half full of your own pond water

Approx. 10 gallons of water holds 100 fingerlings. Each White Amur and Koi requires 2 gallons of water and must be placed in a container with a lid or a liner that can be tied at the top. All fish guaranteed to be delivered in good condition, however, we cannot guarantee survival after being picked up.
