b. FEMA Grant Update

- 1. Anticipating being funded. Working with Administrative Assistant to learn FEMA GO portal to accept and report on grant. RFP process in place from the 2D Model selection process.
 - **a.** Have not received any recent updates, still in the waiting process to see if we were chosen to be funded.

c. South Licking Watershed Conservancy District Projects

- 1. Budget will be provided for cost share for various projects
 - a. Hawthorne distributed and discussed the many various grants/projects within SLWCD and LCSWCD. She stated that Soil & Water has transferred \$25,000.00 from a renewed CDAR into a Money Market account to hold for future projects. She then stated she would like to contribute \$15,000.00 to the Conservancy District's cost-share to help with their Snagging & Clearing Grant to help them and the Silver Jackets move on to the next step.

Bill Goodman moved to approve Soil & Water's contribution of \$15,000.00 from the District Money Market to assist with SLWCD's cost-share for the Snagging & Clearing Grant. Ron Thompson seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

- 2. Raccoon Creek Debris Field study, Snagging & Clearing Grant- USACE waiting for 2D Model to be complete by Silver Jackets. Feasibility study on hold and cost share has been requested.
 - a. Discussed previously
- **3.** Flood Study- 2D Model complete. Working through the process for public records request
 - **a.** Final Report has been provided for review
 - **b.** Hawthorne discussed needing to research process for public records requests due to the model being owned by two different partners.

Buckeye Lake Region Corp and Buckeye Lake for Tomorrow have agreed to pay \$9,000 for the position. Next steps for LCSWCD to have an AmeriCorps person this fall. Will discuss hiring process at the meeting.

Kim Byce moved to approve LCSWCD enter into an agreement with Franklin SWCD for the AmeriCorps program. Rodney Tornes seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
