### **Stream Team Training**

In coordination with Dawes Arboretum, Licking County Soil and Water will host a Team Training session on May 29th from 5:30 to 7:30 pm. The training will be located off Licking Trails Road near White Chapel Road.

The Stream Team is a Citizen Science Water Quality program focused on the health of our county's streams and rivers. After completing our training, volunteers will be equipped with the knowledge to identify common orders of macroinvertebrates, assess the stream's and surrounding habitat's health, and test for some common



chemical parameters, including dissolved oxygen, nitrate, and phosphate. Through these metrics, volunteers will understand the holistic health of a waterway and determine the potential sources of impairments.

Participants must provide their footwear, preferably tall boots or waders. After training, interested participants will be equipped with a stem team kit and assigned a location. Sign up <a href="here!">here!</a>

### Camp Canopy Scholarship

Licking Soil & Water is offering a scholarship for one Licking County high schooler to attend Camp Canopy!

Camp Canopy is a unique summer camp in Carrollton, Ohio, for students interested in forestry, wildlife, conservation, ecology, and other natural resource fields. It is a week-long, co-ed residential camp open to high school students entering their freshman year to graduating seniors.

The Ohio Forestry Association supports the camp, offering educational sessions with traditional camp activities and adventures. All educational sessions are taught by instructors from Ohio's top natural resource organizations and industry experts from the state's top educational institutions. Together, the OFA and Camp Canopy provide a curriculum that gives a comprehensive overview of the forestry and wildlife disciplines through lessons that incorporate both adventure and education.

## American Wetlands Month

May is American Wetlands Month! Nearly one-fifth of Ohio used to be wetlands, but now, over 90% of Ohio's wetlands have been drained. Wetlands are an essential part of our ecosystems and naturally filter out pollutants in our



water. Some of the most important functions wetlands provide are flood control and habitat areas where 40% of the known wildlife species live worldwide!

There's a large wetland restoration project in Licking County!

Bloody Run Swamp is located on Swamp Road just north of Interstate 70. In 2019, the Stream & Wetlands Foundation acquired an 82-acre parcel near the center of the historic swamp.

Before European settlement, the Bloody Run Swamp wetland was the second largest after the Great Swamp. Indigenous Americans frequented the area for hunting and travel, utilizing buffalo paths and Old Hebron Road. The National Road (U.S. Route 40) construction in 1825 greatly impacted the region, facilitating human expansion. By 1840, the Bloody Run Swamp remained the only regional wetland in its primitive state amidst widespread landscape modification. Read more...



### **Conservation Mini-Grant**

The Soil and Water Conservation Mini-Grant program is an excellent opportunity to help fund a conservation-based service learning project for schools.

In celebration of Soil and Water's 75th
Anniversary, the Board established a Community
Mini-Grant program in 2019. Each year, the
program offers up to \$1000 to Licking County
non-profits, demonstrating the need and ability

to carry out on-the-ground conservation projects.

Last year, eight applications were received from Licking County non-profits, local entities, and schools for local conservation projects. Just over \$5000 was distributed to all eight organizations! The Mini-Grant program is open to non-profit organizations such as schools, watershed groups, local government entities, municipalities, community groups, and civic associations within Licking County. # Get your Rain Barrel this spring!

This spring, consider installing a rain barrel! A rain barrel is an above-ground cistern or container that attaches to a downspout, harvests rainwater from a roof, and stores it for later use. The stored water can be used to water gardens and lawns.

Rain barrels reduce runoff. When it rains, roof water travels down gutters and often



runs off lawns faster than it can infiltrate the soil. In many cases, downspouts drain directly into the street. Utilizing a rain barrel will allow the water to be stored for later use rather than letting it run off the property and quickly enter rivers and streams.

Rain barrels conserve water. Rainfall patterns are quite variable and often inconsistent in different seasons. During below-normal rainfall periods, some communities have imposed water use restrictions (e.g., watering lawns and gardens, washing cars, etc.). A rain barrel, or a system of rain barrels, can provide the homeowner with a non-potable water source during dry spells and drought.
